Hassan Abdulazeez Tunde Was born on 30 December 1994 in Surulere Lagos State and hails from Ilorin east local Government of Kwara state. He attended the Akintan grammar school in Ojuelegba, Surulere Lagos. His artistic career began at The Polytechnic Ibadan where he obtained his national diploma (ND) in general art and later proceeded to Yaba College of Technology where he obtained his higher national diploma (HND). Hassan has participated in several exhibitions in Nigeria.

Hassan Abdulazeez Tunde is a metal sculptor that works with discarded metals and spoons. He uses waste metals to express his inner feelings as art is said to be self-expression. His body of works consist of waste products that cause environmental pollution. His creative expression concentrates on recycling waste materials to make sculptural works such as domestic and wild animals and human figures. He often beats metal sheets to submission to bring out anatomy forms in his works. He uses iron rods and metal sheets to create African motifs and designs. His work explains typical Yoruba and African proverbs and folktales with the aim of embracing and preserving the African culture and tradition for the present and coming generations. His artistic practice symbolizes hope after rejection which is a typical example of his medium of work: sense can still be observed in nonsense. His idea of recycling is his way of contributing to reducing the environmental degradation that destroys our ecosystem.



Born in Cotonou, Benin in 1969, Dominique Zinkpè is a versatile self-taught artist producing drawings, paintings, sculptures and other installations. Zinkpè's artistic skill was rewarded early on when he won the Young African Talent Prize at the 1993 Grapholies

Art Festival in Abidjan, Ivory Coast. Ten years later, during the Dakart Biennial of Contemporary Art held in the Senegalese capital, he took away the prestigious UEMOA Prize for his installation "Malgré Tout!". Zinkpè's work and influence goes beyond borders. His work has been shown all over the world, in Germany, the Netherlands, the United States and France.



Born in 1971 in Benin, he lives and works in Porto-Novo, Benin.

Gérard Quenum is both a painter and a sculptor. His work is mesmerizing - filled with meaning, it invites us to stop and wonder. Quenum is self-taught. In the late 90s, he worked alongside other artists in a group led by Dominique Zinkpè, that organized spontaneous guerrilla exhibitions - called "Boulv'art" - on the streets of Cotonou and Porto-Novo.


It was there that he was discovered and propelled onto the international art scene. Today, Quenum's art is in the British Museum, the Museum Afro-Brasil of São Paulo (Brazil), the Afrika Museum (Netherlands), as well as many other museums, galleries, and collections around the world.

Stanley Ugonabo is a Lagos-based painter from Nigeria. He graduated from the University of Nigeria, Nsukka, with the chime die prize for creative Excellence in Visual Arts in 2019. Currently creating with watercolor and oil paint, He explores realist and surrealist forms and cleverly manipulates human anatomy to tell stories laden with energy and empathy. His art focuses on the impacts of some social phenomena and their effects on the psyche of individuals. Using visual metaphors, he creates narratives to best convey personal viewpoints. In some of his artworks, he distorts the figure in parts and plays with color idiolect to convey mood which leaves an oeuvre of mystified experiences and a compelling statement. Since 2019 he has participated in several exhibitions and had his Maiden exhibition titled "Dreams" in 2021. He was also awarded the prize for "the most promising artist, 2021" at LIMCAF.

Dauda Ademola Mohammed was born in Jos, Nigeria in 1974, and holds a degree in Biochemistry from the University of Ilorin; he also earned a certificate in Graphics and 3d Animation from Aptech (Arena Multimedia). Dauda is a self-taught artist who spent a period of 12 years in the banking industry before leaving in 2015 to concentrate on what he loves and has a passion for. He works in a variety of media including painting and drawing with acrylic and oil paints. Until recently, where he focuses on using 3-dimensional objects like cotton buds, pushpins, screws, Nails, Bottle tops, Drilling on wood and plastics to make amazing artwork. His work combines creativity along with hours of diligent application. Using computer graphic applications and Photoshop, he breaks an image down to a very low resolution and forces the computer to make the image out of only five colors (red, blue, yellow, black and white) He then uses a grid map to show where to stick the object row by row. At first glance, the artwork appears to be a low-resolution portrait, but upon closer inspection, onlookers can see each piece is made up of thousands of colored objects. Dauda drew his inspiration from the love he has for Pointillism, Mosaics, and 3dart. He has worked for several organizations and individuals using these objects in promoting their brands. One major project is the billboard of Lasena bottled Water hung on their building at Ogba near the county Hospital. He used 10,000 yellow, red, blue, black, and white recycled bottle tops to make this amazing billboard with the dimension of 20ft x 8ft. He is a modern Contemporary, Promotional and Experimental artist.

This piece was created with 10,660 cloth buttons that have been neatly arranged on a board sprayed with automotive paint. The buttons are yellow, blue, red, white, and black. The work is inspired by events from his immediate environment, where long-kept secrets that have been withheld between spouses are easily exposed in disagreements, and friends give up their secrets after a small dispute. He's watched politicians also reveal dirty secrets in the public domain due to their egos and greed. This work shows a man whispering to his wife, about a secret but he needs to know if she can keep it. The wife says "your secret is safe with me" and the husband says in reply "I hope so." So, I also ask you! Can you keep a secret?!

Yakubu Kareem, born in 1996, hails from Edo state and grew up in Lagos Nigeria where he had his primary and secondary school education. He later went to Auchi Polytechnic, Auchi Edo state where he got his National Diploma in general arts. Yakubu Kareem's works revolve around the use of materialism, in an expressionistic manner creating something abstract. Over his few years of practice, he's developed a random sense of an approach to every work being embarked on giving each of his works a unique sense of being. Yakubu Kareem is currently practicing art in Lagos, Nigeria.

Wole Lagunju (b. 1966 Oshogbo, Nigeria, lives and works in the United States) trained in graphic design at the University of Ife, now Obafemi Awolowo University, Nigeria. His work is associated with Onanism, a contemporary art movement of the Ife Art School dedicated to reimagining the forms and philosophies of traditional Yoruba art and design. He often pairs this influence with a clash of diverse cultural notions exploring post-colonial hierarchies and hybridization.

Lagunju was awarded a Phillip Ravenhill Fellowship by UCLA in 2006 and a Pollock Krasner award in 2009. His work is held in numerous collections, including Collection Leridon and Fondation d'entreprise Francès (both in France).







Born in 1945, Bisi Fabunmi was predominantly inspired by the 1960s. Artistically, the decade began with the twin movements of Pop and Minimalism emerging at a similar time. On one hand, Pop championed the visual culture of the mainstream and mass media, and of products and consumerism. Artwork by artists like Andy Warhol, Roy Lichtenstein, Tom Wesselmann, and Claes Oldenberg was inspired by the popular culture of the rapidly developing Capitalism of the United States, taking things like advertising, comic books, and ideas surrounding celebrity culture as their primary visual cues. A parallel movement developed on the West Coast in California - a strain that also related to language in art, and is viewed as the initial development of conceptual art. Minimalism developed a formal language with no external references, predicated solely on line, color, and geometric form as key components

of both painting and sculpture. The significant figures of Minimalism included Frank Stella, Donald Judd, and Agnes Martin. Colour Field painting, as practiced by Morris Louis, Kenneth Noland, and Helen Frankenthaler, further explored some of the expressive notions of Abstract Expressionism, but reduced much of the rhetoric instead approaching a more rule-based approach to surface and color that related this practice to Minimalism.

Around the world, a number of artistic movements resonated with the creative concerns of the previously mentioned movements, often with regional specialties and nuance. In Italy, Lucio Fontana and Piero Manzoni established Spatialism, and in Germany, the Zero group under the leadership of Gunter Rambow espoused similar ideas. The influential school of Existentialist Philosophy was an important source of inspiration for artists, with artists like Francis Bacon and Alberto Giacometti achieving international prominence for their idiosyncratic approaches to the human form and the anguish related to the human condition.

Kolawole's sole portrayal of African figures is centered around appreciating the features and characters of his subjects. His expressions are depicted in a vintage historical fashion featuring patterns from western culture. His use of Individual characters in a static realistic composition supports his interest to relate primarily to young African women embracing their natural features. They are composed in a confident and cultured position with an expression that carries a certain manner of gracefulness. This is perceived in the way he portrays his subject's hair in its splendor and the skin tones in their deepest complexion. Born in 1961 in Lagos, Duke Asidere is one of Nigeria's most celebrated contemporary artists with a local and foreign following. He obtained a first-class Bachelor of Arts degree in Painting from Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria in 1988 as well as a Master of Fine Arts in Painting in 1990 from the same university. He taught painting, drawing, and art history at the Auchi Polytechnic, Auchi for five years before starting full-time studio work in Lagos. He was mentored by Gani Odutokun, who had a profound impact on him and his artistic expression. Asidere expresses himself in thick, bold strokes through a wide variety of media including pencil work, oil, acrylic, pastels, and transparencies. Kolade Adekunle Oshinowo, a native of Ikorodu, Lagos State, was born on February 6th, 1948 in Ibadan, Oyo State. He had his primary and secondary formal education in Ibadan and Abeokuta between 1954 and 1966. He worked briefly as a clerical officer with the Cooperative Bank, Ile-Ife before proceeding to Ahmadu Bello University (ABU), Zaria to study Fine Art in October 1968. He graduated from ABU with a Bachelor of Art, with a major in Painting in June 1972. He was employed the same year he graduated by the Federal Ministry of Education and posted to Kings College Lagos where he taught for two years before moving to Yaba College of Technology in April 1974, where he worked as an assistant lecturer in drawing and painting.



Dodd Brown Nkpa (b.1985) is a modern Nigerian artist who was born in Jos, Plateau State, and raised in Asuk-Oyet, An-doni Local Government Area, Rivers State. His father often used artwork, especially terracotta vases, to decorate the family home when he was a child before he received formal training as an artist. He desired a career as an attorney. Even after spending two years at a college of arts and sciences and obtaining a Diploma Certificate in Law, he was unable to gain university entrance. The only thing he was passionate about was art. Prior to enrolling in a diploma programme for a year and gaining admission to the University of Port Harcourt's Department of Fine Arts and Design, where he majored in "painting" and earned a Bachelor of Arts degree, he was self-taught.

"In the face of criticism", the artist enjoins the plus sized to Wear their "spot" like a leopard and be themselves wherever they are. Enough of the wishes of wanting to be the slim model in fashion magazines.
