# INTRODUCTION

## BEYOND MIMESIS

A conscious tilt-away from repetitive mode:

It is fascinating having the opportunity to introduce Kelly Omodamwen exquisite sculptures to this beautiful audience. Mimesis in its original context dwells mainly on the basic theoretical principles in the creation of art works. Kelly has stood on the frame works of Plato and Aristotle's lines of thought to represent nature rather than copying it. As it were, he broke loose from imitative stereotypes that dominates the famous traditional Benin bronze casting practice both in concept, thematic and technomorphical approaches in materials usage.

The art objects presented to us are created purposively and intelligently with the sole aim of satisfying our perceptual appetite. As such, we should endeavor to intelligently look at them with high sense of purpose in order to be able to grasp and apprehend visually the spatial relationships that will aid in distinguishing between qualities of form of extreme subtleties and volumetric convolutions of mass sculptures that inhabit and expel space respectively.

It is a common knowledge that spectators often find it difficult to comprehend the convoluted volumetric arrangement of sculptures surface and internal structures, given to the fact that sculpture truly exists in the 3 Dimensional formations. People with highly developed intellectual and verbal skills hardly come to terms with the fact that in visual matters they may be less well-equipped. To understand sculpture one need to possess and acquire the habit of looking at sculpture for the sake of regarding it as something intended primarily to be perceived. However, we do not require much of these perceptual skills to appreciate the colour, texture, the patina, the subtle graduation of surface tones, the linear qualities of the contours, the silhouettes, the decorative patterns of the direct finger prints on wax that enliven the surfaces of Kelly's sculptures.

In recent times, there's a deathly downward slide in sculpture appreciation. This declination is overtly due to the degenerative decline of public perception, acceptance and favour to sculpture. Forces of hard political and religious fanaticism towards sculpture cannot also go unnoticed.

Art and artists through the ages are known to play different and important roles in contributing to the overall health development, and wellbeing of society. In this regard, Kelly has pretenses to unique stylistic trend with unified thematic direction. The arrays of his works nonetheless chart a common path in appealing to the human conscience through material exploration, philosophical admonition and promotion of cultural creative values.

The stylistic exposition of man's inner strength in all the works evokes an emblem of fixated stylistic consciousness that could be in the time and class of Brancusi and Henry Moore. The pieces are visually characterized by juxtapositioning of frail and deceptive outward look that evokes a feel of weakness through starvation. Contrarily, the inner strength of man is exposed through rich titles like, 9-Lives, Patience, Quest, Resolute, Soul Mate, Trance, Ewan, Strategy, Strive, Adventure, and love encoded among others.

While “9-Lives” presents to us hope as a product and reward of courage in persistence, “patience” admonishes us to strive courageously in everyday challenges. Kelly has engaged the society thoughtfully. He has made steps towards social progresses by visually documenting human collective emotions through the pieces “soul mate” and “love -encoded”.

These sculptures captured the trial of emotional bond between lovers; the lending of helping hand to each other in time of need and scarce trust that should exist among lovers. The awesome momentary feel of soul in flight is captured in the piece, “Trance” which exposes man’s burning quest for celestial co-existence and momentary interactions. “Ewan” connotes the gift of natural intelligence as against artificial intelligence. This intelligence assists man in his “strive” to succeed. “Strategy” reminisces man’s age long schemes in conquering his fears which leads him to be “Adventure-rous”. “Isekhure” expresses the glory of favor around those whom the gods cherish; even disability is no barrier to their success.

# ARTIST BIOGRAPHY

Kelly Omodamwen Born in 1993, he hails from the Oredo Local Government Area of Benin City, Edo State.

Kelly began his sculpting journey as a kid in his grandfather's studio, who was a renowned traditional Benin bronze caster. He had his secondary education at Baptist High School in 2010, after which he proceeded to the Federal Polytechnic, Auchi where he obtained his National Diploma in general art and industrial design, 2015, and a Higher National Diploma with a distinction in sculpture, 2018. He also received the rector's award (Certificate of Excellence) for best graduating student in 2018.

Kelly began producing his sculptures in bronze and in 2017, he discovered spark plugs as a medium in sculpture, which has gained him audience after his documentary with BBC PIDGIN in 2020.

His style of art has evolved over the years, moving from Benin art forms to contemporary forms and also to welded sculptures, which include the repoussé and upcycling of waste materials into functional and aesthetic arts. After decades of dedicating himself to art practice, gathering and merging experience from both informal and formal practice, Kelly has carved a niche for himself, as seen in his body of works over time through his expression of anatomical study and usage of materials.
